This log lists main Hub activities for each month starting in July 2019, when the Hub was relaunched in its new organizational home at Renison University College. Other early developmental activities were carried out for the previous six months.

	- August's webinar provided an opportunity for project to project small group

	populations, 3) Ways to use the Hub's Project Management Tool, 4) Strengthening

	- A standard template for project infographics is under development and intended to
	add to the project descriptions on the Hub website and support project communications
	- Early planning for a virtual MHP-IF symposium with dates tentatively scheduled for

	- Development and refinement of the child and youth mental health promotion
	system engagement pilot protocol
July 2020	- A blog was posted on the Hub website (July 8 th) with guidance on why and how to
	use the new project management tool (introduced at the June 2020 webinar)
	- A new online forum was added to the Hub's website where projects can access the
	project management tool and share their experiences with using it
	- Renamed the Hub Resource Collaborative (formerly called the Hub's Leadership
	Team) to accurately reflect this team's important and unique role within the Hub

Main Activities
- July's webinar focused on new knowledge development within the MHP-IF and two
cross project studies currently in the works: a pandemic adaptations study and a
study that will seek to describe and understand the emerging community of MHP-IF
projects. Projects also shared and discussed ways in which they're using storytelling
as both a research and engagement tool
- Three members of the Hub Secretariat team completed the online San'yas
Indigenous Cultural Safety Training Program
- Ongoing refinements to the Hub website were made to prepare for a public launch
- Ongoing development of Hub social media, scanning and public announcement plans
- A draft Hub social media strategy was developed as part of emerging plans for a
public announcement and launch of the Hub website
- A scanning protocol is under development to inform the Hub's social media strategy,
as well as broader engagement with child and youth mental health promotion
system actors, and Hub supports (e.g., website content, blogs)
- A cross-project analysis of new knowledge development opportunities and Hub
supports is underway as part of the needs assessment
- A bi-weekly webinar highlighted new features and content on the Hub's website in
anticipation of the public launch, and provided space for project sharing of their
adaptations in response to COVID-19 (June 12 th)
- The June 24 th webinar shared a new project management tool developed by the Hub,
and co-designed some initial plans for coordinating public announcement plans for
the MHP-IF projects and Hub (audiences, main messages, etc.)
- A blog with insights from Jamie Gamble on what developmental evaluation might
look like for MHP-IF projects was posted on the Hub website (June 19 th)
- A set of annotated resources on developmental evaluation was added to the Hub's
website
- New online forums focused on developmental evaluation, navigating ethics review,
pandemic pivots, and MHP-IF public announcements were launched on the Hub
website
- Initial shaping of a Hub practicum with an incoming Renison MSW student (starting
Sept 2020)
- A new Hub Secretariat position for an Evaluation Manager was posted and
distributed within relevant networks
- An ethics application for a study focused on describing and examining the emerging
MHP-IF project community was submitted for review
- Project-specific discussions of needs assessment findings were completed in early
May
- A blog on the Indigenous COVID-19 context and some potentially helpful resources
was posted to the Hub website (May 6 th)
- A bi-weekly webinar shared preliminary findings from the needs assessment and
provided an open space for project sharing and discussion (May 8th)
- The first Hub update was sent via email and posted to the Hub website
- Preparation for a public announcement of the Hub, and launch of the Hub website
- A joint meeting of the MHP-IF and Hub teams to provide an orientation to the Hub
website
 A project webinar focused on developmental evaluation (featuring Jamie Gamble)

	- Development of a systems engagement and evaluation protocol with initial plans for engaging with child and youth mental health promotion sub-systems relevant to the MHP-IF (e.g., school based, early years, Indigenous mental health)
Apr 2020	 A new online discussion forum was launched on the Hub website with a first thread related to ways to move towards virtual engagement of target audience and partners during the COVID-19 pandemic Bi-weekly webinars were postponed in April due to a sensitivity to the COVID-19 environment and heavy administrative demands for projects Event briefs from March bi-weekly webinars were posted to the Hub website A blog post on tools for virtual collaboration was posted to the Hub website 12 of the 20 project-specific discussions of needs assessment findings were completed in April The 20th and final MHP-IF project was oriented to the Hub and completed their needs assessment conversation with the Hub Secretariat A updated theory of change for the Hub was developed, with plans for seeking input from stakeholders and refining over time A draft study protocol was developed for examining an emerging MHP-IF community (with an initial focus on MHP-IF projects) The Hub's annual report was submitted to PHAC (including financial, narrative, and detailed reporting against the Hub's work plan and performance measurement plan)
Mar 2020	 detailed reporting against the Hub's work plan and performance measurement plan) A bi-weekly webinar (Mar 13th) with projects to co-design the annual symposium, with a focus on shaping the objectives, topics and format An event brief from February's bi-weekly webinar was posted to the Hub website 1:1 needs assessment conversations completed with all projects with signed contribution agreements (19 of 20 projects) A brand strategy for the Hub was finalized and will be applied to all Hub products, processes, and events, including the Hub website MHP-IF project landing pages on the Hub website were expanded and refined with input from projects The Hub website was updated with additional content and to reflect the Hub brand strategy Plans were developed for project-specific discussions about needs assessment findings to identify new knowledge development opportunities, and what those may mean for Hub supports The Hub in-person symposium scheduled for May 2020 was postponed due to the COVID-19 situation; aiming to re-schedule for later in the 2020/21 fiscal year An open space webinar created space for projects to connect on highest priority topics for them (March 25th)
Feb 2020	 Hub orientation calls completed with all projects that have signed their contribution agreement (19 of 20) First all-project webinar was hosted by PHAC and the KDE Hub on Feb 11th to introduce all the projects to each other, as well as provide more information about subsequent phases of the MHP-IF and ways of working together The Hub's website was soft launched within the MHP-IF community (February 11th) The first bi-weekly project webinar focused on a tour of the Hub website and early findings from the needs assessment (Feb 26th) Planning of the annual symposium program and format
